Folk duo reaches out to community with music

Folk music duo Emith aspires to make music a popular community event wherever they play.

"I grew up in a time when music meant something to the community and I hope that music gets back to that place ... where music is everywhere and people support it," guitarist Stevie Gurr said.

Valley Village-based Emith will perform from 7 to 9 p.m. Saturday, Nov. 15, at Crosstown Records and Collectibles, 1032 East Ave. K, Lancaster. The show is put on by Antelope Valley-based Desert Song Productions.

Gurr and vocalist-guitarist Carol Ann Ives compare themselves to such artists as Fleetwood Mac and Aimee Mann. Emith's music also incorporates melodic influences from rock, folk, country, blues and Celtic genres.

Founded in 2003, Emith has traveled the world performing and writing music. They will perform original music from their yet-to-be released CD "13 Seasons," which is scheduled to make its debut in January.

Songs include "High Sierra," "Empty Your Pockets," "One Step Away" and "Let's Live For Today."

"The song 'Empty Your Pockets' is about getting rid of stuff that is weighing you down and things that you don't need," Ives said.

Ives explained that much of Emith's music encompasses humor and sadness.

"We have not been fearful to venture into any musical territory," Ives said. "We always try to keep it authentic and really our own."

Following the performance, an open mike will be available for audience members who want to share their music, poetry, drama, readings or other entertainment.

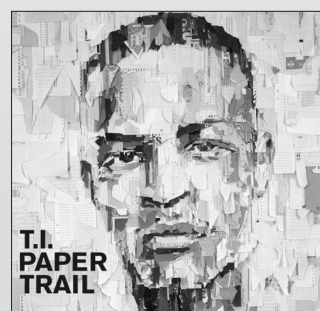
